2 KINGS 8:1-6

PRACTISE HOSPITALITY

Whenever Elisha and Gehazi, Elisha's servant, were in Shunem, there was a Shunammite woman who would show hospitality to them by providing a place to sleep and food to eat (2 Kings 4:8-10). Showing hospitality means being friendly and helpful.

One day, Elisha told the Shunammite woman to move to another place because he knew that there would be a famine in the land for 7 years. So, she and her family moved from that land so that they would not die of hunger.

After 7 years, she came back. Just before she went to meet the king to claim back her house and land that she had left vacant for 7 years, Gehazi was telling the king about the miracle that Elisha had ever performed to the woman's son. Because of this, not only did the king restore her land and house, he also gave her all of the income from the land from the last seven years!

The Shunammite woman showed heartfelt hospitality to Elisha. In return, God did not only protect her from famine, but He also rewarded her with big blessings. God will reward you for showing hospitality to others. You're not too young to practise hospitality. You can start now!


Key verse:

When Ahaziah, the king of Judah, died, his mother Athaliah killed all the royal heirs out of her ambition to reign as a queen. However, Athaliah missed out someone, her one-year-old grandson named Joash. He was saved, hidden in the temple of God and taken care secretly by a priest named Jehoiada.

Jehoiada was a man of God and wanted Joash to be protected and safe, although he knew that should Athaliah find out about it, he would be killed. Jehoiada took a big step of faith, knowing that it was what God wanted him to do. He stood up for God's way. Six years later, Jehoiada's effort and courage really paid off. Joash finally reigned as the king of Judah at the age of 7.

In life, there are times when you need to be brave and take a step of faith. If you decide to just stay in your comfort zone without doing what God calls you to do, you might lose the chance of witnessing God's wonderful work.

Let's keep our church clean and respectable so that all of us can come and worship God with so much joy.



2 KINGS 13:14-19

WHOLE-HEARTED FAITH

Jehoash, king of Israel, visited Elisha. Elisha knew that the king was about to face the Syrians. Elisha asked him to take a bow and some arrows, face the east window and shoot his arrows towards the east, where the location of Syria was. The arrows represented Israel's victory over Syria.

Once done, Elisha asked him to take the arrows again and hit them to the ground. He hit for 3 times only and it made Elisha angry. Elisha said Jehoash should have hit for 5 or 6 times so that he would strike the Syrians for 5 or 6 times and destroy them.

Due to this, King Jehoash would only manage to strike Syria for 3 times. It demonstrated that Jehoash had half-hearted faith in God. Had he used this opportunity to practise a whole-hearted faith, he would have conquered Syria completely.

Just like to Jehoash, God also gives you many arrows of help when problems arise. Through the Holy Spirit and His word, God will guide you on how to have a powerful prayer. Don't just pray three times and stop. Keep praying with a whole-hearted faith till you get a complete victory over your problems.

2 KINGS 23:1-3 & 21-25

READ THE BIBLE
