

BOAST NO MORE

When King Xerxes could not sleep, he commanded his man to read the king's history record book to him. It was written in that book that Mordecai had saved the king from the evil plot by the king's doorkeepers a few years back (Esther 2:21-23). He found out that Mordecai had not been rewarded for his heroic act. Therefore, he planned to give a great honour to Mordecai.

Mordecai never even once tried to boast about his heroic action nor requested for a reward for his action. He kept silent. Mordecai had proven that God sees and acknowledges our good deeds even when nobody notices what we have done.

After achieving a success, it is normal for people to have the tendency to brag about it. Bragging or boasting is showing pride and glorifying yourself. It is actually stealing the glory that belongs to God alone. Remember that all the good things that you have are from God.

God is watching over you all the time. He is pleased when you help others and do your best sincerely without bragging or boasting about it. Let's use your success to glorify God's name instead of your own name.


Key verse:

GOD EXALTS THE HUMBLE

While Haman was finally punished by King Xerxes, Mordecai was given a signet ring. A signet ring was a symbol of full royal authority. Mordecai was exalted to a higher position, a position where Haman was placed before. Esther appointed Mordecai over the house of Haman. Wow, what a promotion!

This was how God exalted a humble person like Mordecai. A short while ago, Mordecai was just a low rank officer in the palace gate. The next moment, he became the second highest rank after King Xerxes. Esther 10 says that he was the most important man among the Jews. And his fellow Jews respected him very much.

Who, but God alone, could do such a thing? When God exalts His people, it is not for them to glorify their own names. God has a purpose for promoting His people. His purpose is for them to do greater things so that His plan will be fulfilled.

Let's be humble under His mighty hand. Wait patiently for the honour that comes only from Him at His perfect time. God exalts the humble.

Key verse:

Matthew 23:12 For those who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted.

Prayer

Dear God, let me always be humble under Your mighty hands as all the rewards and honour come from You alone in Your perfect time to lift Your name high. Amen.



JOB 1:1-8

BE A PERSON GOD CAN BE PROVD OF

Job is a wealthy man living in a land called Uz with his large family and extensive flocks. The Bible writes that God said that there is no one on earth like Job as he is blameless and upright, a man who fears God and shuns evil. This was how God described Job. What an extraordinary thing to say of someone. And it was splendid because this statement came from God Himself.

Blameless means free from guilt or innocent. Upright means honest and just in actions. Job was known as a courageous man who feared God and shunned evil. Fear of God corresponds to conducting our lives in respect and acknowledgment of God. Job treasured his fear of God. Job turned away from evil that the world offered and he also guarded his heart from it.

How would you want God to describe you? Would you want it to be just an ordinary description or an extraordinary one like Job's? Let's learn from Job together and be someone whom God is proud of.

Psalm 15:2 Walk straight, act right, tell the truth.

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Prayer

Dear God, I want to be someone who is blameless, righteous and upright like Job. Let me be someone whom You are proud of. Amen.



JOB 2:11-13

COMFORT IN SILENCE

Job was in despair because within a day, he lost his children, servants and wealth. He had three friends. They were Eliphaz, Bildad and Zophar. They came and visited Job and wept with him for seven days and seven nights. They knew what Job needed was silent encouragement and comfort. They sat silently until Job decided that he was ready to talk.

There are times when you feel so down and what you need is just some comfort in silence, not in lengthy words. The things you need are a listening ear, prayer, someone to lean on, someone to cry with or just a comforting hug. Sometimes, those silent actions are more helpful than any words.

Sometimes, physical presence might become the most comforting way to help someone who is grieving from a loss or who is feeling hopeless. Sometimes, having someone else to cry with you makes you feel comforted and less lonely. Sometimes, a comforting hug can be more healing than a thousand words.

Just be there for your friends in their suffering. Just make yourself available to accompany them. May you be a blessing for your friends.

EVOTION

1 Thessalonians 5:11 Therefore encourage one another and build each other up, just as in fact you are doing.

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Prayer

Dear God, give me wisdom so that I can react appropriately to comfort my friends when they are in despair. Amen.

JOB 6:11-13

GOD'S LIMITLESS STRENGTH AND POWER

A fter Eliphaz spoke to Job, Job started to answer him. Job honestly confessed to his friends that he felt that he had no strength, power and felt hopeless. Job felt so powerless to help himself. He felt he had no strength to stand up and to live again. A child is a lifetime-treasure for parents. And he happened to lose all of his children. He felt empty and hopeless.

As children of God, you and I can always turn to God as He is our strength and shield and He is powerful. You should never lose hope. God is absolutely committed to us. He loves us with an everlasting love. He is faithful and never leaves us. He is always available for us.

At certain times, you might be stressed over your tests or exams or things that are happening at home despite your effort to live the kind of life that pleases God. Rest assured and believe that God Himself will give you power and strength for a victorious life. Your strength is limited while God's is limitless.

Psalm 28:7a The Lord is my strength and shield. I trust Him, and He helps me.

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Prayer

Dear God, I need you. Let me find strength and power in You. Embrace me in Your arms and never let me go. May Your grace abound in me every single day. Amen.

JESUS IS OUR MEDIATOR

ow Job wished there was someone who could speak to God on his behalf, someone who could help him escape from his misery. Job cried out for someone to stand between God and himself. Job was hoping for a mediator.

A mediator or a go-between is someone who stands in the middle of two people or two parties to settle a dispute. At that time, Job had not known God completely and he had not had a personal encounter with God. Praise God! In the end, He revealed Himself to Job and made Himself known to him.

You and I are blessed to have Jesus as the mediator between us and God. Jesus has made peace between God and us by dying on the cross to cleanse our sins. By dying for us, Jesus has made it possible for us to speak directly to God through prayer. And God revealed Himself to us through Jesus.

ven in his despair, Job still could acknowledge God's mighty power. He proclaimed that God was the one who created him. It would not be possible that God who created him would abandon him in the end.

Just imagine this. You sewed your own dress from scratch or built a big building out of lego-blocks for many weeks. There is no way you would want to destroy it. You would want to take care of it with so much love because you spent so much time and effort to make it!

There was a glimpse of hope that shone brightly behind his suffering. Job found there were reasons to be thankful to God despite his suffering. Job could not deny God's past work in his life as his Creator. He had lived for many years surrounded by God's blessings and he didn't let his suffering make him forget about God's kindness.

You may not understand why you sometimes have to face a difficult time, but it is a good idea to stop for a moment and reflect on the kindness and care that God has shown to you up to this point.

DEVOTION

Job 10:12 You gave me life and showed me kindness. And in Your care You watched over my life.

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Prayer

Dear God, thank You for creating me with tender love and designing my life for a great purpose. Thank You for giving me life, love and provision. Amen.
