Due to jealousy, his brothers sold Joseph as a slave to traders and he was brought to Egypt. From there, Joseph was sold to a very important Egyptian man, Potiphar.

GENESIS 45

GOD CAN FLIP ANY SITUATION

Joseph looked at the 11 men who were standing in front of him. Although they did not recognize him, Joseph knew clearly they were his brothers. He remembered the horrible day when they sold him to be a slave in Egypt.

Tears began to stream down Joseph's face as he said, "I am Joseph!" When Joseph saw how terrified his brothers were, he told them, "Come closer to me, I am your brother Joseph... Don't be worried, don't blame yourselves. It was God's plan. God sent me here ahead of you to save lives."

Joseph was so powerful in Egypt. He could just easily take revenge on his brothers. But he chose to forgive them because he had faith that God was in control of everything even in the most uncomfortable situation. God is with you just as he was with Joseph and God can easily flip those unhappy things around you into great things, just as what He did in Joseph's life.
